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Introduction

In 2024, RAHMA Islamic Relief Fund delivered humanitarian assistance across eleven countries through programs in emergency relief, health, education, and livelihoods. Approximately 270,000 people were reached, with interventions ranging from food security and emergency shelter to hospital maintenance, school construction, and youth livelihoods. The organization maintained its focus on principled, accountable, and needs-based aid while strengthening operational resilience and partnerships.

2024 Highlights

- Emergency assistance implemented across conflict- and disaster-affected contexts, including Gaza, Sudan, Syria and Myanmar.
- Health support enabled wartime continuity of care in Gaza through maintenance of critical equipment and facilities.
- Education investments in Somalia contributed to increased attendance and improved teaching quality.
- Livelihoods programming in Morocco advanced youth economic empowerment through agricultural opportunities.

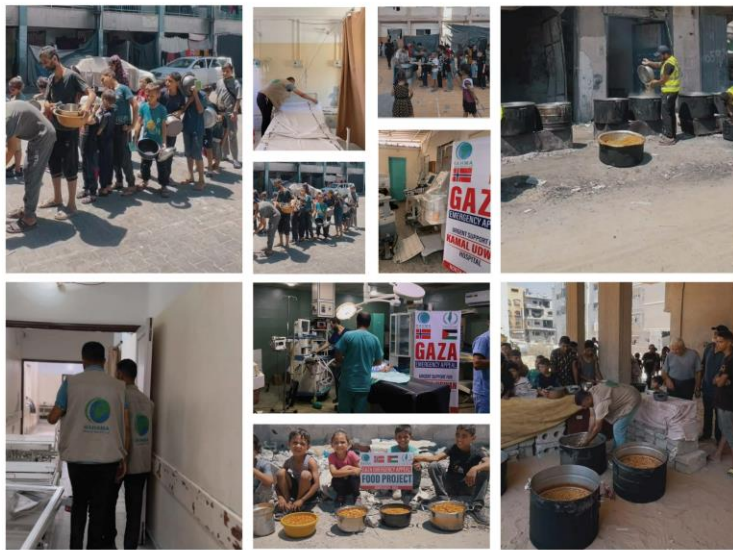

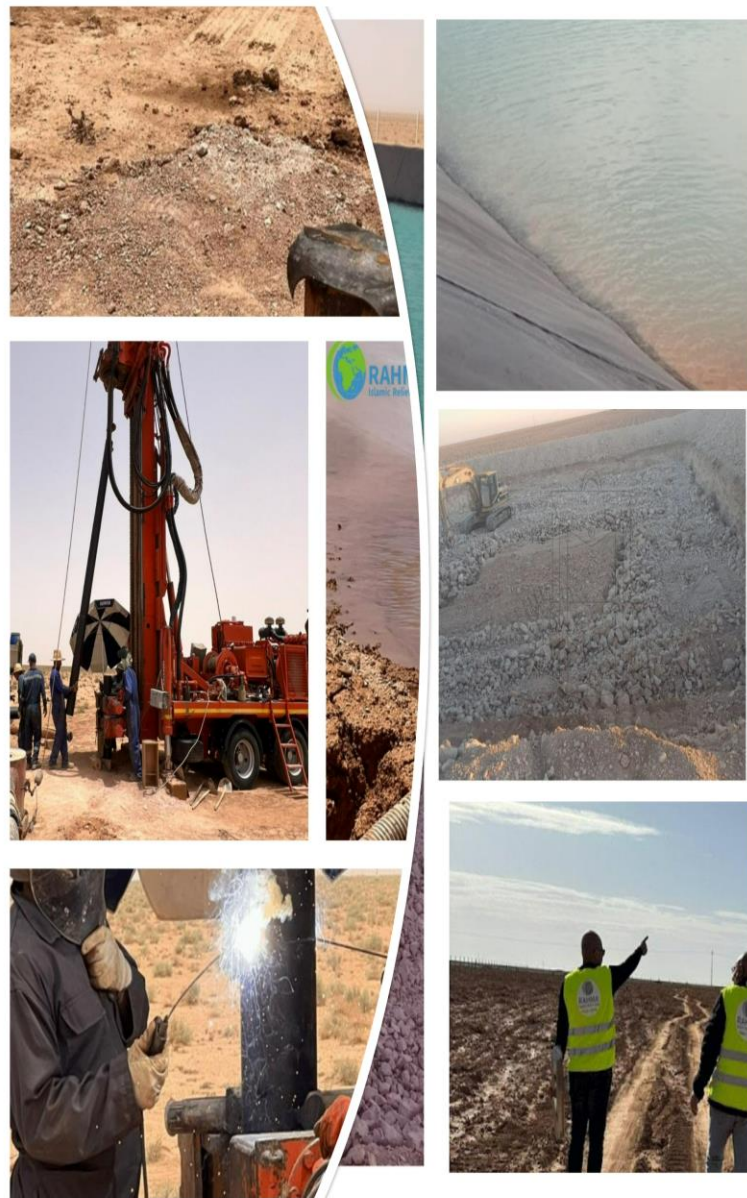

Outcome	Over 150 youths worked temporarily in the first year; one family of five remains employed on the farm

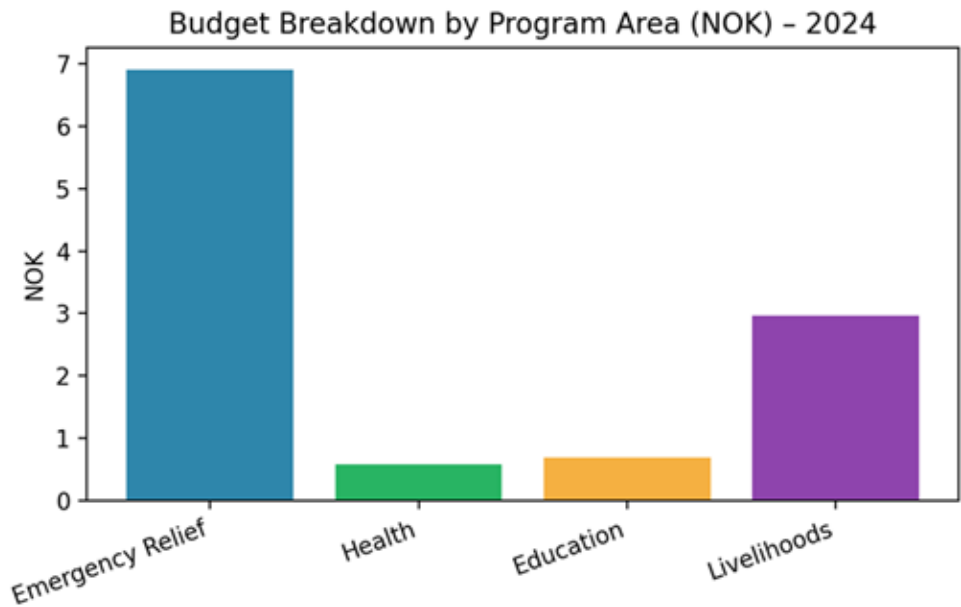


Financial Overview

Accountability, Risk & Learning

RAHMA IRF applies needs-based targeting, works through vetted local partners, and adheres to humanitarian principles. Operational risks included access constraints, volatility in conflict zones, and supply chain disruptions. Mitigations involved flexible programming, diversified suppliers, and strengthened remote monitoring. Lessons learned include the value of prepositioned stocks for seasonal responses and the importance of robust equipment maintenance in health facilities.

Outlook for 2025

In 2025, RAHMA IRF will consolidate gains in core geographies, invest in monitoring and evaluation systems, and expand partnerships to enhance reach and impact. Priority areas include safeguarding, data quality, and localization of aid.
